County of Chambers a citizen of the said County  
recommence and State of Texas do solemnly  
swear upon my oath, that I was born in the  
County of Warwick and State of Indiana, on  
the tenth day of December, in the year of  
our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirteen  
(1813) and I am a full grown man over  
twenty one years of age - at this time.

At the age of four years old, I emigrated  
to Texas town in the year of A.D. 1817 and  
settled in Red River County Texas on the place  
known at this day, as Red River county, in said  
State, and remained in Texas two years, and  
after the expiration of said two years my  
father moved from Texas, and coming  
with him, into what is now known as  
the Indian Territory - and Charlot-  
tation, and remained 7 years in the  
Indian Territory until the latter part  
of 1821, when he again moved back to  
Texas - and settled in San Augustine  
Texas - and remained at San Augustine  
Texas, until 1837, and after 1837 I moved  
to Panola County - Texas and lived in Panola  
County until 1856, and after 1856 I lived  
in Still & Colleton's County Texas until  
1869, and after 1869, I have lived and

resided in the County of Harrison and State  
of Texas. And I do further swear upon  
my oath, that I am a Texas Veteran and  
that I am entitled to a pension under  
the Law of Texas granting Pensions to  
the Surviving Veterans, who fought for  
Texas in Indian wars in the war of  
the Revolution, against Mexico - and I  
also swear upon my oath, that I was a  
Member of Capt Baily Andersons Company  
- and am enlisted as a soldier in said  
Company in the Troops of Leg and Aug.  
with A.D. 1832. and served and fought in  
said Company in the half of the  
Peoples and in the half of 44<sup>th</sup> Co. and  
about the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of August A.D. 1832. I  
was present in said Company - and  
was in the battle of Stagg Docher. and I  
was in the half of Texas against the Mexican  
during one day - and <sup>fourth</sup> ~~present~~ the battle was  
over - and <sup>fourth</sup> ~~present~~ the company fled and  
was present. I was present, fought, took  
active part, as a soldier in said battle  
of Stagg Docher in <sup>1832</sup> ~~the~~ and served and  
participated therein on or about said 2<sup>nd</sup>  
day of August 1832. That I was a son of  
Captain Baily Anderson, who commanded  
- my Company in said battle of Stagg Docher

That up to the fight was over (a few days) my  
father Capt Bailey Anderson gave me  
leave of absence to go home to Sande-  
-justine - in Company with Theophanes  
Thomas and Pinkney Court, who had  
also been in said battle, and I never  
rejoined my said Company and my term  
from the fact the fighting ended, and  
a few days after I returned home, my  
whole Company arrived home <sup>through my</sup> and  
we were all mustered out <sup>to discharge</sup>  
- I found further review of the said Capt  
Bailey Anderson, and was not called  
out again, my discharge was a verbal  
one, and not a written discharge  
that there were no written discharges that

I ever received.

And I do further declare upon my  
oath, that I am the same iden-  
-tical Elias Haggard Anderson  
who was a member of said  
battalion to Capt Bailey An-  
-derson's Company in the  
said months of July and  
August of the year A.D. 1852.  
and served as a soldier and  
participated in the fight  
in the battle of Moog Do Ches;

in said country on or about 2<sup>nd</sup> of  
August AD 1882, and that I am entitled  
to an award to a pension -
